



Changes in Florida State Scholarship Programs

House Bill 7045:
School Choice



✓ Maximizes School Choice

✓ Expands K-12 Scholarship Eligibility

✓ Increasing options for: students with unique abilities, lower income families, military families, adopted and foster care students.

Legislation Highlights:

- Increased individual scholarship amounts to 100% of the state funding allocated to the child's education.
- Ensures scholarship priority for children in foster care, out-of-home care, or whose household income level does not exceed 185% of the federal poverty income level.
- Eliminates prior school requirement for the McKay scholarship. (effective 2022 - 2023 school year.)
- Empowers military families with school choice.

Eligibility:

- Students of families with higher incomes (\$100,00 for a family of 4)
- Siblings of Gardiner students.
- Dependent children of military personnel.
- Student with a wide range of diagnoses.
